EDUCATION _

The Watercolor Society of Indiana seeks to educate Indiana residents about the discipline of the watercolor medium through exhibits, juried competitions, classes, discussions, demonstrations, outreach programs, and community service.

WSI was the recipient of the James C. Lentz Memorial Fund in 2010. Every year, this fund provides a \$1,000 scholarship to a high school senior who intends to pursue a college degree in the visual arts. In 2022, WSI awarded the James C. Lentz Scholarship to Chloe Sun, who will attend Carnegie Mellon University.

New in 2022, WSI hosted ColorVision, a fundraiser for art education and community outreach in Indiana. Thanks to volunteers, donors, sponsors, and bidders, ColorVision raised \$6000 to pay for watercolor classes in underprivileged neighborhoods throughout Indiana. The Watercolor Society of Indiana is proud of the opportunity to support and serve our communities.

In March, WSI hosted a *Beginner Level Workshop* taught by WSI Signature Member Jo Belmont. In July, Ken Call, AWS, NWS, TWSA-M, taught *Portraits*, a 4-day workshop. In October, Iain Stewart, AWS, NWS, will teach *How to Keep Spontaneity Alive in Your Painting*, a 3-day workshop. WSI is grateful to bring well known, talented watercolor artists to Indiana to share their talent and knowledge.

WSI provides educational demonstrations to its members as a benefit of being a WSI Member. The offices of WSI house a lending library for WSI Members. Friends and Members have donated more than three hundred books on watercolors, techniques, and visual arts.

WSI truly appreciates and extends many thanks to the donors and members who contribute to these educational activities.



Born and raised in Rochelle, Illinois, Ken went on to graduate from the American Academy of Art in 1980 with an Associates Degree in Illustration and Watercolor. He worked as a national freelance artist for many years and spent 1993 and 1994 studying and painting in Paris, France.

Ken has created over 500 illustrations for books, magazines, art publishers, advertising agencies and corporations. Starting in art school and all through his early years as an illustrator he was encouraged to paint in many different mediums and styles.

"In the end, I settled on watercolor. The spontaneity and flow just fit my personality and style. What I look for and strive to achieve can only be captured in this wonderful medium. The beautiful play of light and shadows, especially on and around the human figure, is what draws me in and gives me my inspiration."

Many of Ken's originals are hanging in galleries and homes across the country. Ken has achieved signature status in AWS, NWS, MTWS, MOWS, IWS along with becoming a TWSA Master in 2017. He has won numerous awards including twenty Best in Shows, and his work has been featured in Watercolor Artist and American Artist Watercolor.

In 1982, Crawford Donnelly and Stephen Edwards discussed the possibility of a watercolor club in the State of Indiana. They resolved to tackle the task of organizing and generating interest in such a group. Letters were sent to artists across the state, inviting them to a first meeting for organizational purposes.

The first meeting was held in October 1982, at the Indianapolis Art League, now the Indianapolis Art Center. A committee was selected to draft a constitution and by-laws for the group. This committee consisted of Crawford Donnelly, Roger Frey, James Curtin Lentz, Wilbur Meese, and Shirley Werner Carr. A draft was submitted to potential members for their approval in January of 1983. The constitution and by-laws were adopted at a second meeting, and Wilbur Meese was elected the first president. During the next few weeks, one hundred twenty Charter Members joined the Watercolor Society of Indiana.

The organization became a registered nonprofit corporation in Indiana in September 1983. The first annual exhibit was held in November at the William H. Block Company Auditorium in downtown Indianapolis. There were one hundred and one paintings, and the Best of Show was awarded \$400. Since 1991, annual exhibitions have been held on the grounds of the Indianapolis Museum of Art as well as other prominent places.

WSI's foundation status as a 501(c)3 with the Internal Revenue Service became official on April 18, 1995. Today's members express their gratitude to Wilbur Meese, Jean Vietor, Frank Vietor, Shirley Werner Carr, and to all the Founding Members who shared a dream.

Activities of the Society have increased over the years as our talented artists appreciate and continue to produce high quality watercolor paintings and educate the public about this beautiful, transparent medium. WSI has artist, student, and patron members statewide.

Purpose of the Watercolor Society of Indiana Promote interest in and awareness of watercolor painting. Sponsor educational programs and competitive events. Annual Juried Exhibition Digital entries are submitted for acceptance by a nationally recognized jurist. Following the painting selection, awards are selected and later presented at the opening reception. The exhibit is open to the public in the Brett Waller Gallery in Newfields/Indianapolis Museum of Art.

Non - Juried Membership Exhibits Any member may submit a painting to these Exhibits. In 2022, WSI hosted four Membership Exhibits in Indianapolis, Connersville, Fishers, and Vincennes, IN.

Education WSI awarded one scholarship this year to a high school senior pursuing a college degree in either fine arts, art education or design. WSI members continue to teach in schools around the state. WSI partners with various organizations, community centers, and art associations to fund student camps throughout Indiana.

Social Opportunities A spring luncheon for members and guests is held at the Second Presbyterian Church in Indianapolis. A fall general membership meeting is also being planned. All meetings are free and open to the public.

Workshop Programs Learn new techniques or update your skills with talented instructors. WSI offers beginner level, intermediate, and advanced level workshops.

Membership Perks Discount to Workshops. Free Admission to Artist Demos. Member Exhibits including the Juried Exhibit with \$9000 in total awards given. In 2021, WSI introduced a new Member Website and Database to increase communication and offer more Social Networking, Sales, and Promotional opportunities for WSI Members. In 2022, this site continues to develop and offer more for members.
